### Academic Senate Executive Cabinet November 19, 2018 Office of Athletics Compliance Report

#### **General Office Information**

-The Associate Athletics Director for Compliance oversees the Office of Athletics Compliance (OAC) and has a dual reporting structure to the Athletics Director and the Office of General Counsel. -The OAC has four full-time staff members, one intern, and one staff member who works in the OAC but reports to the Registrar's Office.

-The OAC is responsible for maintaining compliance with NCAA and Pac-12 rules by investigating and reporting rules violations, requesting relief from rules in unique situations (waivers), and providing rules education to various groups.

## **NCAA Violations**

-The NCAA has established a three-tier penalty structure for violations of NCAA rules.


- Level III: Inadvertent, isolated, and/or limited violations, which often carry minimal penalties and require rules education.
- Level II: Systematic violations, which carry significant penalties that can include postseason competition bans, financial penalties, scholarship reductions, recruiting restrictions, and head coach suspensions.

• Level I: Egregious violations, which carry Level II violation penalties in greater measure. -Most University violations in the last four years have been considered Level III violations.



#### **Institutional Investigations**


-15 investigations were conducted during the 2017-2018 academic year.

-The most from any one program involved the sport of football (7 investigations).

-Investigations involved alleged violations in the areas of extra benefits, playing and practice seasons, recruiting, personnel, academic conduct, and sports wagering.


-Of the matters investigated, one Level II infraction was discovered and one investigation is pending.

## **2017-18 INVESTIGATIONS BY TOPIC**






#### Waivers

#### **Educational Program**

2017-18 Waivers by Bylaw

-The OAC provides NCAA and Pac-12 rules education to Athletics Department staff, coaches, studentathletes, University entities, and representatives of the institution's athletics interests.

-Athletics Department staff members are required to attend in-person rules education sessions throughout the academic year: Staff must attend at least four sessions and coaches must attend at least eight sessions. Student-athletes receive monthly education.

-The schedule and topics of rules education sessions are based on new rules, previous year's violations, items of concern, and nationally significant issues.

-During 2017-2018, the OAC conducted 143 formal education sessions, a 24% increase from 2016-2017.

#### **NCAA** Probation

-A preliminary report setting forth a schedule for establishing an education program and system of monitoring personnel was submitted to the NCAA Office of the Committees on Infractions on July 10, 2018.

-A final report demonstrating the institution's progress in fulfilling corrective actions and penalties imposed as a result of the infraction will be submitted by March 31, 2019.

-A comprehensive, year-long plan was developed for in-person and written education for the University, Athletics Department, student-athletes, and boosters.

-A comprehensive monitoring calendar was developed for in-person practice and contest observations.
