Dear Council Members:

I am writing to provide my strong support for the proposed curriculum changes in the Environmental and Sustainability Studies (ENVST) Program. The name simplification of three emphases makes sense and does not impact the curriculum within the emphases. I also agree that adding two additional POLS choices in the required course area, will create an easier pathway to completion for ENVST students. Finally, transforming the fifth emphasis into an online option for students will help meet student demand for flexible class options that allow them to complete their requirements and graduate in a timely fashion. Student Data Warehouse analyses show that over the past five years, ENVST majors (primary and non-primary majors) have grown by 59% -- from 206 to 327 students. As this major has grown, so has student interest in an online option.

I have met with Director Brett Clark and Associate Director Jenn Watt about the steps necessary to implement the above curriculum changes and do not foresee any obstacles. Most importantly, I feel confident that the proposed changes will help ENVST better support student persistence and timely graduation without compromising the program's high quality. For the online emphasis option, we are working with Cory Stokes (UOnline) to formalize MOU's to move that effort forward.

In sum, I am excited about the new possibilities that these curriculum changes will provide for ENVST majors and wholeheartedly support their requests.
