



## **Animal Pinch Pots**

Create a clay animal friend that also doubles as a bowl to keep small treasures in.

**Length:** 30 Minutes + 24-hour dry time **Difficulty:** Medium

## **Supplies You Will Need**

- Air-dry or oven-bake clay (about 3 oz or the size of an egg)
- Watercolor paint & brush
- Small cup of water

Paper plate or wax paper (to protect work surface

## **ACTIVITY INSTRUCTIONS**

Parental Warning: Oven use

- 1. Start with a piece of clay about the size of an egg (roughly 3 oz clay) Roll clay into a ball
- 2. Use thumb to poke a hole into the center of the ball
- 3. With thumb still in the center of the ball, pinch the clay into a bowl shape by squeezing clay between thumb and forefinger ¾ of the way around the ball. You will leave extra clay on one end to create the face
- 4. Begin creating the face by pressing and squeezing the clay into your desired shape on the end with the extra clay
- 5. For ears, pinch extra clay upward. For a tail, squeeze the back side into your desired shape. Feet can be pressed out of the bottom of the pot if desired
- 6. Smooth out the wrinkles and lumps in the clay with your fingers
  - a. Young children often understand this best by telling them to stroke or pet their animal in one direction from front to back
- 7. When your animal is the shape that you want it, use watercolor paints with only a LITTLE water to color your pinch pot
  - a. Too much water will make the clay go soggy
- 8. Allow your animal pinch pot to dry for 24 hours (may need a little longer if clay is very thick) in a warm safe place, but out of direct sunlight
